

Riesa has an excellently developed rail network connecting it to all national destinations. In half an hour you can reach Dresden or Leipzig. The InterCity-Express stops in Riesa several times a day. Right next to the train station is the bus station, so you can quickly change between means of transportation. Riesa also belongs to a large and welldeveloped bus network. If you want to Aarriveing by car it is recommended to use the national roads via the roads Bundesstraße B169 and B6 to Riesa. These roads connect our Town with the highways 4, 13 and 14.

Cycle tourists following the Elbe bike path will be led directly through Riesa. Tourists with boats can dock at the jetty of the water sports club at kilometer 107 of the river Elbe. Hikers/walkers can arrive by bus or train and start the hike/walk on the ecumenical pilgrimage or the Saxon wine trail here.


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The legend of Riesa's giant

There was once a giant who came to the shore of the river Elbe on his travels. Before he crossed the river, he stopped for a short break. He felt a pinch in his boot, which was caused by little grains of sand and little stones that were collecting on his long travels. He sat down by the shore, took off his boot groaning and turned it around. What came out was a big hill on which the first buildings of Riesa were created. The people of Riesa interpreted the name of their city that way (Note: "Riese" is the German word for giant). However, it is historically proved that the name is derived from the convent name "Reszoa". This name also appears in a certificate from the year 1119, in which the foundation by Bishop Dietrich of Naumburg is mentioned, making it the first monastery in the Mark Meißen. He used the name of a small Slavic settlement in the mouth of river



Jahna in river Elbe. "Reszoa" means something like terrain cut, which is loosely translated as "place at the river mouth". The place name Riesa as it is known today appeared in 1451 for the first time.

Besides the giant from the legend, the city's coat of arms, which is divided into three parts, shows an anchor, a townscape with the town-hall convent and the church and a red rose with a golden seed. The red rose is derived from the coat of arms of the Riesa family of the Baron of Welk, the last private owner of the manor. The golden anchor symbolizes Riesa's importance as a shipping and trading place on the Elbe for centuries.

First mentioned

In 1119 the monastery "Reszoa" founded by Bishop Dietrich of Naumburg is mentioned in a document for the first time.

It is the first one of the Mark Meißen at that time and is run by the Benedictine order.

Name "Riesa"

The name comes from a small Slavic settlement at the mouth of the river Jahna into the river Elbe.

"Reszoa" means something like terrain cut, which is loosely translated as "place at the river mouth".

- Europe's largest sculpture, 25 meters high weighing 234 tons
- the artist was inspired by one of the sessile oaks depicted in Caspar David Friedrich's paintings

Historic monastery complex

- public guided tours from May to September

Zoo

- directly on the east wing of the monastery
- about 55 native species

In huge aquariums, which contain roughly 20,000 liters of water in total, fish romp about, which live naturally in the river "Elbe".

Chapter House

- former meeting room of the nuns
- restored in 1999
- used as a wedding hall today
- included in public tours

Churches

- Monastery church (Riesa´s oldest church, church tower with Beroque dome, 370-year-old babtismal font)
- Trinity church (neo-Romanesque central building, 75 metres high, large altar made of Westphalian marble)
- Church of Riesa-Gröba (is located near the Elbe bike path, Baroque interior design, ornately carved ornaments, coats of arms and angel figures)
